Quad-County COVID-19 Update: 14 New Cases and 23 Recoveries

(Carson City, NV)- Carson City Health and Human Services (CCHHS) is reporting 14 new cases and 23 additional recoveries of COVID-19 in the Quad-County Region. This brings the total number of cases to 12,443, with 11,808 recoveries and 225 deaths; 410 cases remain active.

During a data audit, it was determined that a previously reported death lived outside of the Quad-County Region. This individual was initially reported as a Carson City case and death. The total number of cases and deaths reflects the removal of this individual as well as the new cases identified today.

A county is flagged for elevated disease transmission if it meets two of the three criteria:

- 1. Average number of tests per day (per 100,000) < 100.** The average number of molecular tests conducted in the most recent complete two week period in a county, divided by the number of people living in the county. This number is then multiplied by 100,000 to control for varying populations in counties. Due to reporting delay, this is reported over a 14-day period with a 7-day lag. Counties that average fewer than 100 tests per day will meet this criterion.
- 2. Case rate (per 100,000) > 200.** The total number of cases diagnosed and reported over a 30-day period divided by the number of people living in the county. This number is then multiplied by 100,000 to control for varying populations in counties. Counties with a case rate greater than 200 per 100,000 will meet this criterion.
- 3. Case rate (per 100,000) > 50 AND testing positivity > 8.0%.** The total number of positive molecular tests divided by the total number of molecular tests conducted. This number is then multiplied by 100 to get a percentage. Due to reporting delay (which may be different between positive and negative tests), this is reported over a 14-day period with a 7-day lag. Counties with a test positivity > 8.0% paired with case rate greater than 50 per 100,000 will meet this criterion.

Quad-County COVID-19 Weekend Update: Saturday (4/24/2021)- 1 Death, 18 New Cases and 28 Recoveries

For Saturday, April 24, 2021 CCHHS is reporting an additional death due to COVID-19 in the Quad-County Region. The individual was a female Carson City resident in her 80’s. CCHHS is also reporting 18 new cases and 28 additional recoveries of COVID-19 in the Quad-County Region. This brought the total number of cases to 12,379, with 11,740 recoveries and 226 deaths; 413 cases remained active.

Quad-County COVID-19 Weekend Update: Sunday (4/25/2021)- 20 New Cases and 12 Recoveries

For Sunday, April 25, 2021 CCHHS is reporting 20 new cases and 12 additional recoveries of COVID-19 in the Quad-County Region. This brought the total number of cases to 12,399, with 11,752 recoveries and 226 deaths; 421 cases remained active.
