Quad-County COVID-19 Update: Three New Cases and Ten Recoveries

(*Carson City, NV*)- Carson City Health and Human Services (CCHHS) is reporting three new cases and ten additional recoveries of COVID-19 in the Quad-County Region. This brings the total number of cases to 1,243, with 1,112 recoveries and sixteen deaths, 115 cases remain active.

The new cases are:

- A male Lyon County resident under the age of 18 with a connection to a previously reported case.
- A female Carson City resident in her 60's with no connection to a previously reported case.
- A female Lyon County resident in his 50's with no connection to a previously reported case.

Carson City Health and Human Services is working to identify close risk contacts to prevent further spread of the disease. Due to medical privacy requirements and to protect their identity, no further information about the cases will be released.
