EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The 2024 East Fork Fire Protection District Annual Training Plan serves to inform Career and Volunteer members of the training requirements and opportunities during the 2024 calendar year. The Annual Training Plan details the scheduled topics and objectives for each month that will be conducted as by either Volunteer Fire Departments, Station Captains, Training Captains, and/or Battalion Chiefs. Any mandated training shall be conducted by a Training Captain or other specialty instructor.

The 2024 Annual Training Plan is a comprehensive training plan that meets the current and future needs of East Fork Fire Protection District. This approach allows the District to increase its operational and response capabilities which in turn increase the level of service that the department is capable of delivering to the citizens and visitors of Douglas County.

The plan utilizes a balanced approach for all disciplines including Emergency Medical Services, Fire, Technical Rescue, Hazardous Materials, Wildland Fire suppression and leadership, Engineer and Fire Officer Development. This balanced approach requires individuals to increase their knowledge and abilities in all response disciplines while simultaneously allowing individuals to specialize in subjects according to their skills and interests. The plan is designed to be specific yet allow for flexibility in the event of training that is made available or as District needs dictate.

Following the strategic goals developed by the Training and Safety Division, the following programs continue in this years plan including Officer Development, Rope Rescue, Wildland classes, and in-house EMS CEU delivery program. Many of these programs will lend to certification will conclude with either Nevada State Fire Marshal Training/NFPA certification, International Fire Service Accreditation Congress (IFSAC) certification, or National Wildfire Coordinating Group (NWCG) certification.

The key to the Annual Training Plan is flexibility. The following monthly parameters have been established to ensure balance and continuity across all training disciplines to accomplish the established training requirements. This balance will allow personnel to train in all disciplines throughout the year and maintain the necessary skills and proficiencies essential for optimal performance in the case of an emergency.

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TRAINING EXPECTATIONS

There are a few general expectations for training:

All trainings shall provide for safety first

All members must attend mandated trainings

All career staff members are to log a minimum 20 hours of training per month in RMS

All members shall log any outside training in RMS

Battalion Chiefs and Training Captains shall ensure training hours have been logged at end of each shift

All VFD members must sign up for training via email at effpdtraining@eastforkfire.org

All VFD members will sign in on Training Sign in Sheet and forward to District Office for entry into RMS

REGIONAL TRAINING ACADEMY

It is anticipated that East Fork Fire Protection District will participate in the Regional Training Academy Class 24-1 which is anticipated to start in late February of 2024. A Regional Training Officer (RTO) will be assigned should that happen. Additional instructors may be sent on an as need basis as determined by the Lead RTO. Once the need is determined, the Deputy Chief of Training and Safety must authorize the overtime prior to it being sent back to the RTO to fill. The on-duty Training Captain may be assigned as well depending on the complexity of the topic. An Academy schedule has been produced and distributed. With the permission of the Battalion Chief and appropriate coverage of response district(s) Companies are encouraged to attend and observe the academy process but not impede academy training

PROBATIONARY TASK BOOK and MODULES

Upon completion of the Regional Training Academy, each Probationary Firefighter will participate in an additional 40 hours of District orientation and basic training. Probationary Firefighters will also perform a ride along on a 48-hour shift where they will observe crew dynamics on EMS Incidents.

Probationary Firefighters will have 30 days to complete Core Competencies as outlined in the Procedure 301.02, Core Competencies.

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The Probationary firefighters will receive a Task Book divided into modules. The first module is the Paramedic Assessment Module (PAM) (Paramedics only). The PAM is outlined in Procedure 301.03, Paramedic Assessment Module. The focus of PAM is EMS however, Captains shall perform other All-Hazard trainings to maintain proficiency for the entire crew.

The other modules in the Probationary Firefighter Task Book include EMS, Structure Fire, Wildland Fire, and Technical Rescue. Each module contains tasks, information, and procedures associated with each discipline. The Captain needs to ensure each task is completed and signed off. Again, although there are focused modules, it is recommended that Captains maintain proficiency in all disciplines by performing all-hazard topics from time to time.

Captains are required to submit a monthly evaluation for the Probationary Firefighter each month. The PAM requires additional documentation including the Daily and Major Evaluation forms

QUAD COUNTY HAZMAT TRAINING

The Quad County Hazmat Team requirements entail members attend 2 drills and 1 skills day per year. Participation in a Quad County Team activation on an incident will suffice as a drill.

Monthly Trainings will be provided by the on-duty Training Captain. All volunteers must attend all mandated training classes. Additional monthly training topics will be focused on the priorities established in Operations Procedure 200.20- Volunteer Response Operational Objectives.

Once the Training Division has completed a topic, it is expected that VFD level training on the topic continues to build proficiency. If a VFD needs assistance or further training, please contact the on-duty Training Captain or on-duty Battalion Chief for support.

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ON-SHIFT- MONTHLY TRAINING and COURSE DESCRIPTION

At the beginning of the month, The Training Division will send out the months calendar which includes any special COURSES, FIRE/RESCUE TOPICS, of which MANDATORY topics will be in bold, and any EMS topics. The monthly folder, found on the East Fork Share drive, will be loaded with any necessary supporting documents for the monthly topics. The Training Captain shall deliver any mandatory training topics.

COURSES

Any topics under events are additional and usually a certified class. These classes will require a Training Request Form approved by the shift Battalion Chief forwarded to the Deputy Chief of Training and Safety. In most cases, these courses will be offered more than one time to allow for members each shift to participate.

Description	This course 1 is designed to meet the training needs of the Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) and/or Incident Commander Type 5 (ICT5). Topics include operational leadership , communications, LCES , and tactical decision-making .

Description	This is a skill course designed to produce student proficiency in the performance of the duties associated with Engine Boss, Single Resource (ENGB). Topics include engine and crew capabilities and limitations, information sources, fire size up considerations, tactics, and wildland/urban interface.

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Title	S-223 (Fireline Medic) (EMPF) (Fireline EMT) (EMTF)
Description	This course is designed to provide the skills and knowledge needed to perform in the role of Fireline Medic (EMPF) or Fireline EMT (EMTF) as a Single Resource on Wildland Fires. Topics include position overview; supplies and equipment; assignments as a Single Resource; lessons learned; Medical Unit Leader expectations; emergency evacuations; communications; documentation; navigation and responsibilities; wildland safety considerations; and medical emergencies specific to the wildland arena. This is required to be eligible for the Off-District Single Resource List

Title	S-212 (Wildland Fire Chainsaws)
Description	This is an instructor-led course intended to be presented at the local level. The course lessons provide introduction to the function, maintenance and use of internal combustion engine powered chainsaws, and their tactical wildland fire application. Field exercises support entry level training for firefighters with little or no previous experience in operating a chainsaw, providing hands-on cutting experience in surroundings similar to fireline situations

Title	S-200 (Initial Attack Incident Commander)
Description	This course is designed to meet the training needs of the incident commander type 4 (ICT4). It is presented in a discussion/exercise format. The six instructional units include Foundation Skills; Intelligence Gathering and Documentation; Size Up the Incident; Develop a Plan of Action; Post-fire Activities; Evaluating Incident Objectives and Manage the Incident. Evaluation of the student is by unit tests and performance-based evaluations.

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	and resource use in the interface, action assessment, plan update, and after-action review.

Title	FIRE OFFICER 1 CAPSTONE
Description	Fire Officer 1 Capstone is designed for those whose wish to obtain their IFSAC Fire Officer 1 certification, Acting Captain qualification, and eventually promote to the position of Captain. This course will build on the NFPA Fire Officer 1 course and will give the student a look at East Fork specific policy, procedure, and operations.

Title	EAST FORK DRIVER OPERATOR
Description	This course will meet NFPA 1002, Standards for Fire Apparatus Driver/Operator Qualifications. This is a two-week course. Upon completion the student will be qualified to take the State Certification Exam. A Task Book will be issued and must be completed before applying for Acting Engineer. Due to the logistics of this

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	course there will be a minimum requirement of 5 students and a maximum of 10 students.

All activities and scenarios used in this course are based on structure fires. With the real possibility of being the first to arrive at an incident, the CO's initial decisions will have an impact throughout the entire incident. It is vital that COs be able to make good management decisions that have a favorable impact on the eventual outcome

Title	STRATEGY AND TACTICS FOR INITIAL COMPANY OPERATIONS (STICO)
Description	This 2-day course is designed to meet the needs of Company Officers (COs) responsible for managing the operations of 1 or more companies during structural firefighting operations. This course is designed to develop the management skills needed by COs to accomplish assigned tactics at structure fires.

Students work in small and large groups to examine case studies and solve simulated tabletop incidents that range from simple house fires to large multiple-story commercial and industrial occupancies.

EMS

In person CEUs will be a major change for this year’s plan. Each month, one two-hour session will be held in person, recorded, and uploaded to Target Solutions for anyone who is unable to attend. In addition, all members shall complete 1 hour minimum of CAPSE CEUs on Target Solutions. Each month will also include a protocol review and skills set. The plan for the future also includes ACLS and PALS refreshers annually.

Outside Paramedic and AEMT Refreshers will only be supported on a case by case basis. The following will serve as the selection criteria for those who apply:

- Must be due for recertification without the ability to obtain enough hours with District delivered and Target Solutions CEUs
- Did not attend an in-person refresher in 2023
- Priority courses will be those held regionally at no cost (Truckee Meadows, Central Lyon, North Lyon)

There will be a return of specialized training offered throughout the winter and spring to enhance the wildland education of Wildland Firefighters and Lead Wildland Firefighters.
